The 1st year of funding totaled \$7,240,800</p> <p>A Contract with the City of New Orleans to implement the 'Steps to a Healthier US' program. <i>Step Together New Orleans</i> was formed to address physical activity and nutrition of New Orleanians. 1st year funding from HRSA totaled \$1,140,835</p>	<p>Contract with LA Office of Public Health – <i>Children's Health Services</i>: \$129,692</p> <p>NNPHI receives a new grant- the <i>Fostering Emerging Institutes Project (FEIP)</i>.
